



JUST AROUND THE CORNER

10 Prospect Street is not an architecturally important structure, but it is the oldest home on Prospect Street, with the earliest found mention of it being 1833. The house originally stood slightly southwest where the house on 75 Center Street now stands. It was sold by James Wadsworth for \$1.00 to Robert and Jane McBride...in the deed it states Jane McBride showed 'unwearied kindness' to members of James' family, 'now demised'. Robert and Jane emigrated from Ireland in 1821 and arrived in Geneseo where Robert worked on the grounds at the Homestead and Jane worked in the house. In 1833 Mrs. Patterson, Jane's mother, lived in the house. She emigrated with Robert and Jane in 1821. It's not known who occupied the house after Mrs. Patterson died in 1857 as Jane and Robert moved next door to 73 Center Street in 1854. The McBride's had no children.

In approximately 1868 the home was moved to where it now stands, 10 Prospect Street. Unfortunately, it's unknown who or how the house was moved. In a map dated 1872 the house is shown with the name A. French

as occupier/owner. Alonzo and Anna French and five of their eleven children lived in the home during this time period. Alonzo was a house and sign painter and had a paint shop at 12 Main Street for quite a few years. The French's lost five of their children before the children reached age 25, three of them were under the age of five. Anna died in 1891 and Alonzo in 1897. In 1897 the French estate sold the house to James and Elizabeth Baird.

James Baird emigrated from Ireland in the mid-1880s. He and Elizabeth Dysart, who emigrated from Ireland in 1895, were married in 1897. James was a gardener for a private home, and Lizzie was a seamstress who worked from home. They raised four children here, Margaret, Marion, James, and Irvin. People in town may remember Irvin who was involved in the local horse scene. James passed away in 1948 and Elizabeth in 1950. The house was left to Marion Baird; when she passed away it was left to Irvin.

In the mid 1970's a room was added in the rear of the house for rental purposes. Although it was attached to the house it had no entry into the home. After Irvin passed away the house was bought and sold several times and seemed to to fall into a state of disrepair. In the 1990s new owners poured time and energy into rehabilitating the house. The layout appears to be much as it would have been originally...an informal entry leading to a staircase which brings you to the second floor with three bedrooms; on the main floor there is one large room to the left and right of the entry; the kitchen is off the back of the room on the left; and the addition added in the 1970's is straight behind the staircase. It is a simple, functional house. When the current owners broke thru to join the 1970's addition to the rest of the house the first thing encountered was a 16" hand hewn beam with the original door latch attached, a testimony to the time period it was built.



What strikes me in learning about the prior inhabitants is how well these people with modest beginnings flourished and thrived in Geneseo during their time here. To arrive in a country with next to nothing, find and hold successful jobs, and have the wealth to accumulate multiple real estate holdings is truly the American Dream.
